Energy bills misery, flood devastation and the moon's marvel

The spiralling cost of living has been an increasingly urgent topic of conversation in the UK. But for many people, huge rises in energy prices are about to turn a difficult situation into an impossible one. Political inertia, caused by a lengthy Conservative leadership contest, has only added to a deepening sense of national frustration.

The likely new British prime minister, Liz Truss, has spent the summer promising tax cuts to her Tory party supporters - but her pitch may soon be upended by a crisis demanding urgent financial intervention from the government.
