# Methane, Nigerian elections, female fury and vast music arenas

It's no secret that methane is one of the most potent greenhouse gases, with scientists attributing 25% of global heating to its atmospheric release. But a new Guardian analysis by environment editor Damian Carrington lays bare the exent of the problem, identifying more than 1,000 of the world's worst emitters. 
